
Fawkham CEP School Parents Questionnaire February 2020

Parents were asked to complete a questionnaire for each of their children in the school. We have received 43 responses . Some questions were left blank, some ticks straddled two columns and some questions had two boxes ticked these were spoilt questions and not counted. The numbers show the percentage of parents. Where 25% (11 parents) answer negatively with Disagree or Strongly Disagree these have been highlighted as significant areas to focus on. Unfortunately only a few parents (28) completed the back of the questionnaires to highlight what they consider to be the strengths and areas for development of the school.

- Appropriate homework as otherwise parents end up having to do it, as child doesn't understand the level being given.
- I know it takes a lot of organizing but I really miss the stay and learn mornings.

BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES

- I feel that on occasion the schools punishments are inappropriate and too strong
- A contact book so that teachers and parents can stay in touch more
- Maybe work at supporting educational programmes/school in underdeveloped countries
- More discussion and learning about being kind and how to deal with bullying
- If an issue has occurred at school parents are not always made aware and have heard through other children telling their parents – if you want us to discipline the children at home for their behavior during the day – tell the parents.
- Parents need to be informed first if children will be punished for not reading enough times etc, we appreciate the importance of reading at home and we do aim to do this 5 times a week but it is not always possible especially if they also have homework to do and spellings to learn. We feel that homework can often be added steress and not enjoyable, we would prefer to use that time to concentrate on reading and spelling that we feel is more important.

LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

- Just keep up the good work., I am pleased with all aspects of the school x 2
- The only thing I have found difficult is the expectation of taking and picking your child up from trips and visits which can sometimes be within the school day, as a full time working parent this can be difficult.
- Sometimes information and requests can be last minute
- Sometimes difficult for working parents to attend all activities
- As a working parent I would be interested in a breakfast club, this would also help with the parking problems.
- Awareness that some parents work full time and can't always respond as quickly as others.
