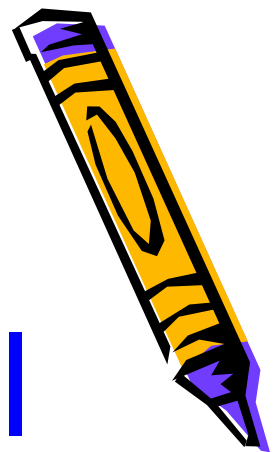

# Kent Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021

## There are three tests:

- English and Maths Multiple Choice – 1 hour – 25 minutes per sub test and 5 minutes practice exercise English – comprehension and literacy skills based questions
- Reasoning skills Multiple Choice (VR and NVR) – 1 hour – VR and NVR sections
- Creative Writing Test (unmarked) – 40 minutes to include 10 minutes planning

# Marking and pass mark:



- English and Maths Multiple Choice – 1 hour
- Reasoning (VR and NVR) Multiple Choice – 1 hour
- Creative Writing Test – only looked at if children miss by a couple of marks or for appeals purposes
- Age standardised then aggregate score – maximum 423
- There will be a minimum aggregate score and a minimum score for each paper as in past years
- Last Year 332 or more in total, no lower than 108 on any paper
- 2019 - 330 or more in total, no lower than 110 on any paper
- 2018 – 323 or more in total, no lower than 107 on any paper
- Since 2014 - 320 or more in total, no lower than 106 on any paper

- SCAF National closing date – **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November**
- **National offer day – Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2020 – emails sent after 4pm and letters sent by 1<sup>st</sup> class post**
- **Acceptances/refusals closing date – 16<sup>th</sup> March 2020**
- **Appeals - closing date – 27<sup>th</sup> March 2020**
- **Waiting list requests – 16<sup>th</sup> March 2020**
- **22<sup>nd</sup> April 2020 KCC re-allocates places**
