

Class Newsletters

PE Kits

We have decided that on PE days children are going to continue to be permitted to wear their PE kit to school for the day. As a reminder, as per our prospectus and uniform policy, children need to wear:-

Plimsolls, plain navy shorts/skorts (no logos/white stripes etc.) and Tee shirts in team colours with the school badge. Trainers can be worn on the field and plateau.

All children's clothing must be clearly named (including footwear). NO JEWELLERY to be worn on PE days. Plain navy blue or black jogger bottoms/leggings can be worn on top of shorts/skorts during cold weather along with their school jumper/cardigan.



Reminders



Just to remind you that the only water bottles that children will be permitted to have in their classrooms will be the school water bottles or clear, totally transparent bottles – far too many children were failing to follow this rule last academic year – please make sure that your child has the correct bottle. Only water will be permitted to be consumed during lessons unless a medical reason and proof of this is submitted. The school water bottles can be purchased for £1.50 from the school office. Keeping children hydrated is important for them to be able to focus and keep their brains active.

Children are ONLY permitted to bring in fresh vegetables or fresh fruit for consumption at playtimes.

Children who have packed lunches are ONLY permitted to bring in a maximum of two processed food items in their packed lunches — further encouraging healthy eating. Please may we request that packed lunches do not contain nuts or any obvious nut products e.g. peanut butter/Nutella as we have some children in school with severe nut allergies.

Children are not permitted to bring in pens, pencils, rulers, pencil cases or any other stationary items as these are all provided by us.

Under no circumstances are cars to park in front of the houses in the Village Hall car park – ONLY in allotted spaces, thank you.

Attendance

As you know attendance is extremely important if your children are to thrive and progress well in their education. Missing one or two days during a week has a huge impact on their ability to keep up in lessons on their return, as often they will have missed some of the essential building blocks of learning. The government says that attendance should be at least 95% to be reasonable and 98%+ to be excellent. Children who fail to reach these levels are having their life chances considerably reduced.

Obviously, the pandemic has had an impact on school attendance during the last two years and this has had a profound impact on some children's learning.

Please help us to help your child have the best chance at thriving at school by ensuring excellent levels of attendance.

Covid 19 Update

New guidance has been published during the summer that outlines all of the changes to the response that the government are making in light of being at Step 4 of the Roadmap. Guidance for parents can be found here:-

New guidance has been published for schools and, as always we are following the guidance to the letter.

The main differences that will impact on the way that we operate as a school during the coming months are:-

- There will no longer be bubbles at any point during the school day so we will be able to hold worship, playtimes and lunchtimes as we always do as a whole Fawkham Family community.
- There is no requirement to wear face masks we may ask that you wear them when coming into school for events where there are large numbers of people gathered such as Christmas Fair, Productions and Church Services but you no longer need to wear them when outside on school property.
- Since 16th August test and trace and isolating guidance has also changed:'children and young people aged under 18 years 6 months who usually attend school, and have been identified as a close contact should continue to attend school as normal'

For adults, anyone who has had two vaccines or who hasn't had the vaccines as medical reasons mean that they cannot have them, will no longer have to isolate if they are a close contact.

- SO, IF we have a positive case of Covid in our Fawkham Family, no siblings, family members or bubbles will need to isolate unless informed by the test and trace system that they have to. Close contacts will be advised to take a PCR test but they may continue to attend school/work whilst they are awaiting the PCR test result. I am delighted to say that by early October all of our staff in school will have received both vaccines.
- We will have a contingency plan in place should we have a local lockdown situation or if we are asked, as a school to resume bubbles.

The following strategies will continue to be used here at Fawkham to help minimise any potential spread of the virus:-

- Regular cleaning during the school day of touch spots and surfaces, including toilets.
- 'Catch it, bin it, kill it' use of tissues to blow noses and cover coughs and sneezes.
- Regular thorough washing of hands.
- Good ventilation in all rooms windows and doors open as the weather gets colder children will be permitted to wear more layers of clothes on top of their uniform to keep warm but these must be blue, black, grey or white in colour.
- To start with, keeping a minimum number of visitors coming into the school buildings until we see the what happens in the few weeks of the academic year with regards to the virus.

As I said at the start of my newsletter, we start our year full of hope, that we might return to our 'normal' Fawkham Family school year. I will of course keep you updated if anything changes.

Worship

Don't forget, to keep you informed, on our website homepage there will be a 'thought' and a 'prayer' for the week, both of which link to the theme of worship for that week.

I know that this academic year holds lots of exciting opportunities for the children to thrive and progress. Together we - the governors, staff, children and you will help our 'Fawkham Family' to strive to even greater heights. Off we go......
