THIS WEEK'S LEARNING:	
<u>Subject</u>	<u>Overview</u>
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	We will be working together to make a cocoon using toilet paper. We will be introducing caterpillars and how to look after them. We will be learning about how to make healthy food choices- introduction to food groups.
Communication and Language	We will be playing 'Kim's Game' using fruit from the story of "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". We will be talking about what we can observe from photos of caterpillars and butterflies.
Physical Development	Jasmine PE. Wrapping up a toys in toilet paper like a cocoon. Hole punching holes round the edge of big leaves. Threading caterpillar pasta necklaces. Paperchain caterpillars Sorting healthy/ not as healthy foods.
Literacy	We will be retelling the story of "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". We will be sequencing the story and writing own stories- The very hungry
Maths	We will be exploring how squares can make other shapes and using squares to create patterns. We will be making new shapes with tangrams and using patterns blocks to create a picture.
Understanding the World	Observing the life cycle of a butterfly with our caterpillar garden. Observational drawings of the process of the caterpillar to butterfly in a mini sketchbook. Creating life cycle plates. Make a log pile bug house in the outdoor classroom.
Expressive Arts and Design	Music- Musical stories- Using instruments to represent actions. Painting the food that the caterpillar ate. Symmetry butterflies with splatter paint. Creating a large butterfly for class display.
