Ensure all relevant staff have received paid-for training to deliver the phonics scheme effectively – all 6 modules.
Priority 2 Ensure disadvantaged pupils achieve national average progress scores in reading at end of KS1 and KS2.	<ul><li>Fully decodable books for infants and lower juniors linked to our Phonics teaching.</li><li>Reading for pleasure project throughout the school.</li><li>Ensure low level, high interest reading books are available for lower ability older pupils at higher end of KS2.</li></ul>
Priority 3 Ensure disadvantaged pupils have basic maths skills	Ensure timely interventions – triple I - are put in place, focus on basic number skills, pre teaching and picking up misconceptions.

Priority 2	Buy and embed use of Little Wandle reading books across all year groups to increase reading for pleasure – particularly linked to KS2 children
Priority 3	Establish small group maths interventions for disadvantaged pupils falling behind age-related expectations. Triple I interventions on a daily basis and pre teaching of individuals and small groups.
Priority 4	Children receive programmes of speech and language sessions from a therapist and then support on a daily basis with programmes of support that sit alongside the therapy sessions.
Priority 5	Class teachers tutor the children on a 1 to 1 and small group basis on a weekly basis to ensure catch up takes place and accelerated progress is made.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Attendance – of pupils and staff due to covid Space available to work in 1:1 and small group due to social distancing and lack of sufficient space.
